APRIL IS DISTRACTED DRIVING AWARENESS MONTH



The Driving Force wants you to know that April is Distracted Driving Awareness month. In 2019, 3142 lives were lost due to distracted driving. Distracted driving can come in many different forms such as talking, texting, eating, playing with the stereo or falling asleep. Anything that takes one away from focusing on the road ahead is considered distracting driving.

Perhaps the most dangerous form of distracted driving is texting. According to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration, "Sending or reading a text takes your eyes off the road for 5 seconds. At 55 mph, that's like driving the length of an entire football field with your eyes closed." This statistic is concerning for all ages but increasing alarming for inexperienced drivers such as teens and young adults.

The Driving Force is using social media to raise awareness in April and has shared their top tips to avoid distracted driving.

- Do not read or answer texts. Ask a passenger to assist if necessary
- Set navigation destination before departing
- Do not use your phone while driving. Utilize Bluetooth if you need to make a call and program your car with phone numbers.
- Never drive under the influence of drugs or alcohol
- Take a break when feeling drowsy
- Be on the lookout for pedestrians and bicyclists
- Leave additional space between vehicles. Create a safe distance between you and the car ahead of you especially in a congested area

Remember your actions affect others on the road. Be aware of your surroundings and stay focused. We all need to do our part to keep the roads safe.

"When I am driving a motorcoach, I must be more aware of my surroundings. I see drivers with cell phones in their hands not only while driving but while they're walking as well. Not focusing on what they are doing, can be mortal causing a lot of accidents. As motorcoach operators we have to look at the big picture in front of us. We have to have eyes everywhere. Keeping our distance from other vehicles, doing what we call "rock and roll" which means moving our body, and making sure we have clearance to continue safely to our destination are all ways of taking care of our passengers and keeping them safe."
