Policies

NAME BADGES: Admittance to any function of this BISC meeting requires the appropriate name badge. Fees

RATES ELIGIBILITY: Attendees are expected to be employed in safety-centric, maintenance, operations, consulting or executive/managerial positions by the companies they represent. Registrants found to not meet these criteria will be charged the spouse/guest rate.

CANCELLATIONS/NO-SHOWS: Registrants who "no-show" or cancel their registrations after the cutoff may be charged \$100 or ineligible for refund of fees paid.

BISC MEMBERSHIP

About

The Bus Industry Safety Council (BISC) is an industry-wide bus safety advisory group sponsored by the American Bus Association (ABA). The organization brings top safety professionals together in the North American motorcoach industry with a mission to develop and promote methods, materials, and procedures to enhance motorcoach safety and security.

BISC membership is open to companies and individuals regardless of ABA membership. In addition to bus operators, the council is open to bus manufacturers, insurance providers, trade associations, industry-related organizations, consultants, tour operators, trade publications and government representatives, including safety, inspection, enforcement and regulatory officials.

BISC holds two meetings per year: in January at ABA's Annual Meeting & Marketplace and in June in the Washington, D.C., region.

Membership

BISC membership is reviewed annually. Members are classified as follows:

OPERATORS: individuals from private companies that own motorcoaches/buses and perform a variety of transportation services such as charter, tour, scheduled, school bus, package express, receptive operations, and special operations. Motorcoach trade organization representatives also qualify.

ASSOCIATES: employees of companies or trade associations that supply goods and services to the motorcoach and tour operator industry.

GOVERNMENT: representatives from federal or state agencies who are involved in motorcoach safety and security.

Structure

The council is structured with five standing committees:

GOVERNMENT ACTIVITIES REVIEW: helps achieve industry consensus on regulatory safety issues. The committee develops science-driven industry recommendations and best practices to help companies achieve regulatory compliance.

HUMAN PERFORMANCE: addresses all driver safety and health, performance, recruitment and retention issues, and best practices for bus company employees. The committee also evaluates currently available training materials and develops new training materials based on industry needs.

SECURITY: improves the security of the motorcoach industry by reviewing and improving existing programs and developing security-related industry outreach materials. The committee reviews preparedness, resiliency, mitigation, information-sharing, and response of the motorcoach industry to security threats.

VEHICLE TECHNICAL OPERATIONS: addresses all aspects of vehicle engineering and maintenance and serves as a liaison with manufacturers of motorcoaches and component parts. The committee develops best practices for maintenance and creates other materials.

WORKPLACE HEALTH AND ENVIRONMENTAL SAFETY: identifies, alerts and advises membership on emerging regulatory issues and industry best practices to improve safety compliance and performance.
