Acknowledge the challenges and bridge to the positive




Reports indicate that the driver was at a bar last night. What role do you think alcohol impairment played?


What role do you think driver fatigue played in this accident?

Delivering your Message

React like a human

- Be sincere
- Address the challenge / bridge to the positive
- Don't let perfect get in the way of good
 - Honest, sincere and humble is your goal
 - Perfection takes too much time in an arena where you are already behind

Be on Your Toes

 - Open microphones
 - Don't hold yourself to an artificial deadline*
 - The pack
 - Exit strategy
 - "Friendly"
 conversations with
 reporters you know
